In June we were lucky enough to be up in the west coast of Scotland, working on a boat of course. came over and interrupted him to tell us more about the design he was showing us. Martin introduced us to the lady; this was Shelia Fleet, his mother. Richenda loves a good chat and I saw her eyes light up before she took a deep breath and began to ask questions. Shelia managed to escape after about ten minutes and Martin gave us a tour of the entire workshop. In a world where it's the norm to out-source everything to a continent with cheap labour rates, it was so nice to come across another family business whose focus was not only on the designing of a product but the crafting of it too. Shelia and her team are extraordinary crafts people and it was fascinating to bear witness to the fact that every piece of jewellery is handmade to order, from start to finish in that workshop on Orkney. As Martin walked us through the making of the jewellery he also talked us through the history, development and future plans for the business and I have to say, for us the hours we spent with Martin whizzed by. It was so generous of him to give us that time. I know Neil Thompson Boats is not on the same scale as Shelia Fleet but Shelia and Martin's business ethos and values and their connection to the natural world around them was so relatable that it felt very homely. It was also inspiring to know that there are other businesses out there, other business people like us who love what they do and work hard to do it. EDUCATING NORFOLK





CHRISTMAS GIFT IDEAS

Data Tag is an electronic security system for outboard motors. Costing £40, it is a system that has been endorsed by the British Marine Federation and also the police force who have access to the database of engines registered with Datatag. Obviously no system is fool-proof but we hope that Datatag acts as a big deterrent for the criminal network targeting our harbours.

Drainman: This is a bilge pump for small dinghies and tenders that do not have batteries. The pump is triggered by the motion of the ocean and will keep your boat dry while on its mooring. It's great value, retailing at £54.

FUEL ISSUES AND HOW TO AVOID THEM

This season has seen a rise in fuel related engine problems so we've included information from Honda which we hope you find helpful.

INFORMATION ON FUEL RELATED ISSUES FROM HONDA

What kinds of fuel to use: Honda recommends that you use unleaded 95RON, 98RON or 95 E-10RON fuels. These can be used in all current Honda Power Equipment and ATV products.

If the Honda product is to be used on an intermittent basis (more than 4 weeks between each use) then Honda recommends that you add Honda fuel stabilizer to teh fresh fuel just after purchasing. HOnda fuel stabilizer will not reconstitue stale fuel.

How to store fuel: Store the fuel in a clean, approved and sealed container, if you use a steel fuel can; ensure that there is no corrowsion inside. Store the fuel away from direct sun light, and in a cool place.



SCOTTISH OYSTERS


We headed off to the west coast of Scotland again this year and this time it was to Loch Hourn where we gave a good service to a Norfolk Oyster which had been taken up there 20 years previously. The boat had been looked after using traditional methods, such as rubbing boiled linseed oil into the woodwork. Initially we didn't know this and when we looked at photos of the boat before the trip we were concerned that some of the wood, the seat battens and chocks in particular, might be rotten as they were almost black and we took replacements. However, after a good sanding all the wood was restored to its original colour and there was no trace of rot. The oil had preserved the wood beautifully. It took Richenda and I a full week to get the boat, including all of her mast and spars, stripped back, everything sanded and re-oiled, scrubbed, polished and put back together again. It was fun working in such dramatic surroundings and on a boat that is so obviously a much loved part of the family.

30 YEARS OF THE NORFOLK OYSTER

The first Oyster was built in 1989 and the boat has never lost its appeal. It remains a popular small classic being sailed not only here, in Norfolk, but the world over.

We were unable to hold the annual regatta this year, so instead we are getting together at 4pm on the 22nd December at the Morston Anchor Inn for a Christmas drink and to raise a toast to the Norfolk Oyster.

We hope many of you will be able to join us and we're hoping that we will be able to have a speech from Charlie Ward who remains as passionate as ever about the boat he and John Leather created.

NEW HORIZONS FOR THE NORFOLK RANGE

This is a new boat to the Norfolk range although the Horizon is a boat with a long entwined history with Blakeney Harbour. These boats were used for several decades by the commercial mussel fisherman. At 17ft long they are incredibly stable, have a shallow draught of about 5 inches and great manoeuvrability so are easy to handle along the creeks. The Horizon is a great entry level boat to the Norfolk Range. It is powered with a Honda outboard engine and can be modified as required to be either tiller operated or remote steering. Both tiller and remote engines can come with electric start so that all you have to do is push a button and go. The layout of the boat can be crafted to suit, with several options available from side bench seating or centre thwarts. Stowage can be built into the seating or built into the fore and aft buoyancy tanks. The boat is beamy and can easily be used for family day trips to the point with more than enough room for the dogs, picnic, beach games, fishing gear and windbreaks. The boat is built from GRP and has the best quality rubber rubbing strakes and trim so that yearly maintenance hours and costs are kept to an absolute minimum. The price for the basic boat is from £8,500 (inc.vat) and will vary on size of engine and internal layout requested.

WE TAKE OFF
